BUDGET TRANSPARENCY PROTOCOL

Version 6.0, Final

April 21, 2026

Purpose

To reaffirm the consultation procedure of shared governance while ensuring clarity around confidentiality, timing, and external communications in the annual campus budget process.

1. Scope of Consultation

Budget consultation between the administration and the Academic Senate will continue frequently throughout the fiscal cycle. Materials will be provided with appropriate lead-time for the Senate to fulfill its advisory role per [Regental Bylaw 40.1](#). The Administration will share materials with Council on Planning and Budget (CPB), to include:

- Written briefings on significant financial/budgetary matters, marked as 'Draft' as appropriate.
- Written materials when data are finalized and appropriate for distribution.
- Opportunities for questions, clarification, and feedback prior to formal Senate consultation and Administration's decisions, as appropriate.
- Written data tables in a format (Excel, Tableau download, etc.) from which data can be easily extracted.

2. Treatment of Draft and Preliminary Information

Administration will share timely draft, preliminary, or evolving budget data in written form directly to CPB. Such information is typically not presumed releasable or distributable beyond the immediate consultation context. Information that is still under development will be marked by Administration as 'Draft' in good faith. Privileged, personnel-related, legally sensitive, or system-constrained data will never be shared on the record.

The Senate will conduct responsible analyses and deliberations in a timely manner. If final data are not available then Senate may release analyses based on the best available information, with the appropriate caveats.

3. Confidential Advisory Bodies

Participation in confidential advisory groups (e.g., the Executive Budget Action Group) carries an obligation to preserve confidentiality and deliberative space. Members serving in

these roles do so as advisors, not as representatives authorized to publicly disclose or characterize internal deliberations. Senate participation on administrative advisory groups is not a substitute for the formal consultation process described above. If substantiated concerns about the ability to maintain confidentiality within Senate leadership and select members of the Senate arise, participation in such groups and/or staging of information will be jointly reconsidered to preserve the integrity of the process.

4. Public Dissemination, External Communications and Media Engagement

Neither the Administration nor the Academic Senate will release budget-related internal governance documents, draft reports, or internal correspondence between parties to external media without reasonable advance notice to the other party. When internal materials are shared publicly or released externally, both parties acknowledge that public response or clarification by the other may be necessary. The principle of “no surprises” applies reciprocally. Importantly, public records requests should be referred to the UCLA Compliance Information Practices Office.

5. Timeline and Deliverables

The Administration and Senate agree to the following annual schedule:

Fall:

- CFO provides budget-related materials to CPB, such as a summary and detailed breakdown of core and general funds, balances and projected surplus/deficit, to begin the budget consultation process.
- An annual budget Town Hall for the Academic Senate faculty, co-led by the CPB Chair and the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) (or CFO’s designate), on budgetary news and with a Q&A.

Winter:

- While not required under Regents’ Bylaw 40.1, CPB members will be invited to attend unit-level budget conference meetings to inform their analyses.
- CPB conducts analysis of data shared to date and provides written consultation to CFO, Academic Senate Leadership and the Executive Board.

Spring:

- CPB provides an end-of-year report that identifies the major budgetary issues and discussions that took place in the course of the year.
- Administration provides CPB with the detailed final campus budget for the upcoming fiscal year.

Late Summer or Early Fall:

- Annual budgetary retreat in late summer where Administration and Academic Senate jointly review the budget decisions and process of the prior year and establish top priorities, plans and challenges for the coming fiscal year. Participants will include incoming and outgoing CPB Chairs, Senate Leadership, CFO, EVCP, and Chancellor.

Other:

- Quarterly CPB meetings with the Chancellor and/or EVCP to share perspectives on campus priorities in planning and budget.

6. Periodic Review

This protocol will be reviewed jointly at least annually to ensure it remains aligned with campus needs and shared governance norms.

Intent

This protocol is designed to protect good-faith consultation, mutual trust, and the shared academic mission—not to limit engagement or transparency, but to make both sustainable.
